

Save this tutorial in a folder or print it to keep in your crafting area. This document includes directions on how to create a Desktop Post-it Holder (for 3" x 2" Post-it Notes).



Measurements are given width x length.

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Supplies:

Paper trimmer with scorer, one solid color card stock, Basic White card stock, patterned Designer Series Paper, Multipurpose Liquid Glue, any embellishments you wish & 3" x 2" Post-it Notes pad.

For this tutorial, I used Sweet Sorbet and Basic White card stock, Bee Mine Designer Series Paper and the Bee Mine Bundle (for the popped up Bee).

Directions for Desktop Post-it Holder





All the paper supplies you need



Desktop Base: 5-1/2" x 4-3/4" White: 5-3/8" x 4-5/8" Two decorative strips each size: 7/8" x 4-1/2"



Glue White onto base. Glue side strips to each side, keeping them close to the right & left sides so there is enough room for the next step






Easel base: 3-3/8" x 8-7/8" Score: 2-1/4" & 4-3/8"

Basic White for inside of Easel base: 3-1/4" x 4-1/4"



Glue white onto larger area of easel base.



Flip over and glue two 3-1/4" x 2" patterned pieces to each scored section.

Place the bottom piece close to top fold. You will have a little extra space at bottom, but that will be covered by the Post-it pad when it's flipped up.



Fold down so you can adhere to base.



Add glue to bottom and adhere to center of base.



You can purchase 3" x 2" (51mm x 76mm) Post-it Notes from many stores, including Amazon.







Add glue to back side of Post-it note and glue onto bottom of base.

Stamp any greeting or note on the inside.



Add embellishments.





Side view.



Folds fairly flat to put in an envelope.
